John Henry Smedley, 4805697

Private, Lincolnshire Regiment, 1st Battalion, Infantry, SEAC

John was the son of George William Smedley and Margaret May, née Weston.

George was born 25 August 1884 in Newhall. When he was admitted to the infants' class at the village school on 4 March 1891 the family were living in Morley's Yard, Long Street, Repton. George was previously been at school in Newton Solney. In the census return of the following month his father John was listed as a butcher, born Newhall. His mother Ann was born Coleorton, Leicestershire. George's sisters were Mary and Elizabeth (both dressmakers), Edith, Maud, Catherine and a brother Thomas. Also living with the family was Ann's mother, Hannah Johnson, born Charnwood.

George transferred into the elementary school on 1 December 1892 and left to take up work in January 1901. When the census was taken on 31 March that year John, of Long Street, was recorded as a farmer, George as a grocer's apprentice and his brother Thomas a farmer's son.

In 1911 her parents were living at Bagworth near Ibstock and there were another two small children. At this time Margaret was living with her sister Florence and brother-in-law Horace Tomson in Saffron Hill Road, Leicester. Horace was a cycle dealer and Margaret was working on shawls in the hosiery trade. There was a boarder living at the same house, i.e. Sidney Jerram born in Burton. He was a barman at a hotel.

George and Margaret married in the Market Bosworth registration district in 1915. John was their first child, followed by the birth of their other children i.e. Olive, Emily, Harold, Clifford and Margaret.

In the 1935 Directory George Smedley was listed as a clerk, living in Main Street, Repton. The 1960 County Borough of Burton upon Trent Directory lists his address as 15 Main Street. George died 5 March 1964, aged 78 and Margaret died 11 March 1983, aged 90. They are buried together at the cemetery in Monsom Lane, Repton.

In 1938 John was living in lodgings in Main Street, Repton, and working as a grocer's assistant. While riding his motor bike he collided with a car at Willington crossroads and was admitted to Derby Royal Infirmary. He fractured his knee and suffered other injuries.

John became a private in the 1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment, SEAC. The battalion went into action in India/Burma. John died aged 31, at Derby Royal Infirmary on March 4 1946.

For the battalion's services in the campaign against Napoleon in Egypt, the Lincolnshire Regiment was granted the honour of wearing the Sphinx as a distinguished mark of the King's "Royal Approbation", both on Regimental Colours and on their headgear.
